
C SPIRE VISITS **EVEREST**




On September 28th, 2020, Northwest Mississippi Community College was officially handed the keys for their new satellite campus at Everest! President Dr. Michael Heindl, Associate Vice President for Workforce Solutions and Career-Technical Education, Dwayne Casey, and several Northwest directors joined us for the morning. In addition, Water Valley Mayor Donald Gray, the full Yalobusha County Board of Supervisors, and Water Valley School District Superindendent Mr. Jerry Williams, were also in attendance. Northwest plans to house several different programs within the new space. With adult education, industrial and residential electricical labs, and a fully equipped nursing program, there's no limit to what NWCC will be able to house in their wing of Everest. Several Northwest staff members will be permanently located in this new space, and they plan to start moving in later this month. The new satellite campus will be fully operational by the Spring.



Software Engineer in Residence, John Terenzio, returns to Base Camp:

Base Camp has welcomed back John Terenzio as the software engineer in residence for a third year. He will be working with the students on a weekly basis on coding and career development skills. Terenzio, a remote employee of Airbnb in San Francisco, has also secured space in the incubator in order to bring his links to Silicon Valley into the Everest building. "It's really incredible to see this building come back to life as a tech hub in Water Valley. The incubator space is amazing because it bring technology professionals into close proximity with the students, who can benefit from a real-world tech environment just outside their classroom door," said Terenzio. Terenzio's assistance in the classroom not only gives the students a new perspective on the content, but also allows them to build a close connection with someone who is currently in the software development industry. That is a model we hope to multiply now that we have the space to do so at Everest.
