Base Camp continues to grow and adapt to the needs of our student body and business community. From the original three-year pilot above the B.T.C. Old Fashioned Grocery, we have grown into our new facility at Everest, launched the Pioneer Programmers summer camp for young women led by our female staff and alumni, and launched a new pilot program with the Tennessee Valley Authority for students 20 years of age and above (the Graduate Institute.) We have also expanded our partnership with Northwest Mississippi Community College to offer 45 credit hours to graduates of our traditional program (a/k/a Base Camp Classic.)

We have launched new partnerships with the Department of Labor's Apprenticeship program, the Cisco Net Academy, and Mongo DB to see how these organizations can help us expand opportunities for our students. We also continue to have guests from the tech industry and beyond speak to and mentor our students regularly.

And our students! They continue to work as hard as we can push them, investing their time and dedication in our classrooms every day. Our classrooms are full of students 6 days a week, and two evenings! Our curriculum continues to grow to keep up with the changing tech landscape, and our students layer on top of the core curriculum additional modules addressing cyber security, AI use (and not abuse,) and in their own time have launched a game-development club.

We cannot thank you enough for your continued support of this wonderful program. Because of you, all Base Camp opportunities continue to be offered to every student free of charge, and our students are leaning in with everything they have. Over 35 Base Camp students graduate from our programs each year!





- No previous programming experience is necessary, and all accepted students receive a 100% scholarship.

Eligibility Requirements

- At least 20 years old.
- Ability to commute to Water Valley, MS for classes three times a

 (50 miles) or has the ability to relocate to live within commuting
 distance. We do not cover the cost of housing or fuel for any
 students.
- Ability to attend in-person classes for 15 hours per week.

- Ability to complete 10 hours of virtual work from home per week.
